










Book Report Choice Board

<p>Design a T-shirt based on your book. Write a paragraph explaining your design.</p> 	<p>You choose! Use any random supplies to make a tangible item from your book or that represents the plot/theme.</p> 	<p>Make a poster advertising your book. Write at least a paragraph explaining why you designed it this way. You may draw or use a program like Canva.</p> 	<p>Take an AR test.</p>
<p>Choose an important event from the book. Write a song or poem about this event.</p> 	<p>Write a letter to introduce yourself to a character in the book you read. Tell the character why you want to get to know them.</p> 	<p>Choose an event in the book. Write up the event as a newspaper article. Be sure to include: who, what, when, where, and why.</p> 	<p>Choose an event from the book. Create a comic strip that conveys what happened. You may draw or use a program like Canva.</p> 
<p>Make a timeline to show the sequence of at least ten event in the book in the order that they occurred.</p> 	<p>Write and record a TV commercial that will help to sell millions of copies of the book. Can use a program like imovie.</p> 	<p>Write at least three paragraphs around this topic: <i>I want to read another book like this because...</i></p>	<p>Choose a character from the book. Collect/draw 5 items that relate to that character in an important way. Explain in writing why you chose each item – similar to a story board.</p>
